

In order to be considered for acceptance into the BFA Music Theatre program, you must accomplish the following by August 1st, 2009.

- 1) Write a Letter of Intent and Professional Goals
 - Briefly describe what your professional aspirations are and what you intend to do after graduation;
 - Describe what you hope to gain from the theatre BFA program;
 - Describe what skills you personally would contribute to the program.
- 2) Include a Current Theatre Resume (and photo if available)
 - Include your name, address, contact information and year in school;
 - Describe your general work experience on and off campus;
 - Describe your entertainment arts experience on and off campus (professional and non-professional);
 - List workshops, internships, special programs, professional affiliations or club associations.
- 3) Attach a copy of your current high school transcript or college CAPP report (Curriculum, Advising, and Program Planning).

- **Once we have your information in hand, YOU will need to schedule your auditions:**
 - 1) MUSIC DEPARTMENT AUDITIONS will be held on Saturday August 8th, 2009. They are for placement in theory and voice studios. You can schedule your own appointment by calling 303-556-3180.
 - You will need to sing one prepared song, do some sight singing and vocalization exercises.
 - 2) THEATRE DEPARTMENT - MUSIC THEATRE AUDITIONS will be held the week of August 10th-15th 2009
 - *Once you pass your music audition*, we will contact you to schedule your final audition.
 - For this audition you will need to prepare:
 - 1) One song from musical theatre repertoire and
 - 2) Two one-minute contrasting monologues.

- 3) INTERVIEW:
 - After your music theatre audition, there will be a brief interview with the BFA Committee. Each audition/interview should last approximately one half hour.
