

# Camp Hale Soldier Cleared Of Dealing With Prisoners

CAMP HALE, Colo., April 3—  
(UP)—Sgt. Guido Gundisch of Milwaukee has been acquitted of a charge of “trafficking commercially” with Nazi prisoners, it was disclosed here today.

Col. J. A. Chase, commanding officer, said Gundisch had been cleared by court-martial of the charge which dealt with the purchase of ping-pong balls and a number of radio tubes for use by German prisoners of war. However, Gundisch was found guilty of transmitting a number of pieces of correspondence

from a German prisoner to a civilian employe. *R.M.W. 4-4-44*

Because of his good service record and the fact he did not realize the impropriety of his action, Gundisch has been placed back on his regular job in the camp finance office, Colonel Chase said.

The colonel emphasized that Gundisch was in no way implicated in the escape of two Nazi war prisoners, for which Pvt. Dale Maple of San Diego, young Harvard graduate, and four other Camp Hale soldiers have been charged with treason.
