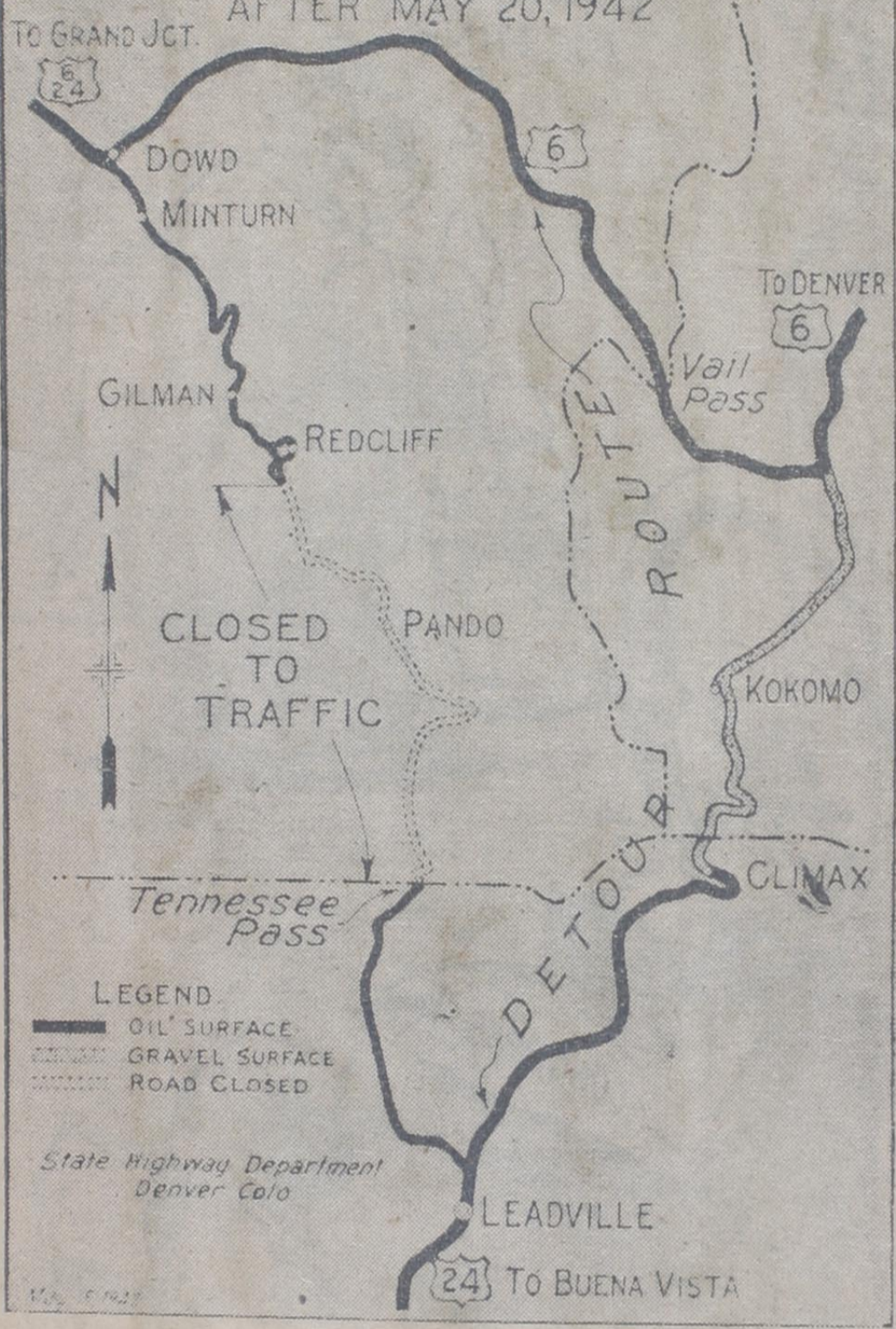

# Ski Camp Project Closes Highway 24

## DETOUR ROUTE FOR TRAFFIC BETWEEN LEADVILLE AND DOWD AFTER MAY 20, 1942



Detour ahead really means something on U. S. Highway 24, starting Wednesday. This map, prepared by the State Highway Department, shows how travel will be re-routed to allow speedy construction of the new road requested by the War Department to serve the new ski-troop training camp at Pando.

To allow unimpeded construction of the new road for the ski-troop training camp at Pando, U. S. Highway 24, between the top of Tennessee Pass and Red Cliff, will be closed to traffic starting Wednesday.

Through traffic will be routed over U. S. Highway 6 at Dowd on the west end, and from Leadville travel will be sent by way of Climax and Kokomo to the junction with U. S. 6.

highway, which will give a more direct route on U. S. 24 and will take out numerous curves and cut-backs which now spread over the area to be occupied by the camp.

Nearly two and a half million dollars will be spent on the new highway officials said.
