Dear Madam:

This is to inform you that you have been provisionally accepted for enrollment in the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps. It is requested that you report at Room 184, Federal Office Building, Minneapolis, Minnesota on March 8 1943, at 1:00 (P) M. for necessary examinations and subsequent enrollment, if found qualified.

The inclosed transportation request must be exchanged at the ticket office of your Railroad Station or Bus Depot for a ROUND TRIP TICKET before you board the train or bus, as designated. Any money expended by you for train or bus fare cannot be reimbursed by the government.

Mental examinations begin each Monday and Thursday at 1 P.M.. If this order does not arrive in sufficient time for you to report on the designated day and hour you should report on the following examination day, reporting your delay to this headquarters.

The examinations will take approximately three (3) days. Upon arrival in Minneapolis you should report to the WAAC Recruiting Office, 184 Federal Office Building for hotel accommodations (Office hours 8:00 A.M. to 5:30 P.M.) If the Minneapolis WAAC office is not open at the hour of arrival you should go directly to the Leamington Hotel where all WAAC applicants are fed and lodged. Any funds expended by you at this Hotel will be reimbursed by the Hotel upon presentation of proper tickets issued by this office with a limit of 50¢ for breakfast and lunch, 75¢ for dinner and \$1.10 per person for lodging.

You must bring your birth certificate if same has not been filed with your application. Also, bring a picture taken within the last thirty days, size 2" by 2".

It is suggested that you do not leave your present employment until after you have been enrolled and you have received the final notice to report for active duty.

The recruiting station will be glad to answer any further questions.
